## PETER AND PAUL

In 65 A.D. during the reign of the emperor Nero, Peter was crucified for treason, though according to a probably apocryphal legend, he tried to escape until stopped by his master, while Paul was beheaded outside the walls, because he had a higher status then Peter, being a Roman citizen. In this respect as in others, their fate bears a striking resemblance to that of the English martyrs, Saints John Fisher and Thomas More who were beheaded because of their high position in society, while the rest of the martyrs of England and Wales were hanged, drawn and quartered, some of them not very far from here at Tyburn.

Neither Peter nor Paul chose their enviable position of closeness to Christ. Peter was introduced to Jesus by his brother Andrew, who got there first, [ John 1, 41], while Saul, afterwards called Paul, was thrown to the ground, perhaps knocked off his horse on his way to persecute the Christians at Damascus [ Acts 9, 1-9]. Their moral and physical frailty, especially in the case of Peter, who denied Christ three times, [cf. Matthew 26, 69-74] needed a second chance. Jesus achieved this with his grace after his own resurrection [cf. John 21, 15-19]. Paul several times confesses his moral infirmity, when he speaks of the sting in the flesh, froth which he asked to be freed [2 Corinthians 12.7]. But he was not freed, in order to keep him humble. We cannot advance spiritually without grace from God and on our part, humility which, as saint Augustine often reminds his readers, is the prime virtue and not an easy one. False humility, as Uriah Heep in David Copperfield, is unreal and can, like many shadow vices, give humility a bad name.

But, despite their many similarities, there is a striking difference between the two, between Peter, whose name means rock, 'Thou art Peter and on this rock [petra] I will build my church' [Matthew 16,18] and Paul, immediately after his conversion is commissioned by the Lord to become the apostle of the gentiles [cf. Acts 9.15]. He was always on the move, always mobile, without any of our modem means of transport, except a boat or a donkey. As he himself tells his Corinthian [2 Corinthians 11.26] 'In journeying ...often'

Peter and Paul express two vital aspects of the church, then and now. She must on the one hand be absolutely firm in her affirmation of and commitment to the doctrinal and moral message of the church. Yet on the other she must never lose her missionary zeal. The gospel is for everybody a vital truth in the secular society in which we live. The omnipresence of God

may blinker us to the importance of evangelisation. The indwelling of God in our hearts can only be achieved through preaching and living the gospel in our words and lives.
