I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

Our Gospel reading this Sunday is the second of five consecutive readings from the sixth chapter of St John, often known as the "Bread of Life Discourse". In the final sentence of this reading, Jesus says, "I am the Bread of Life". These past few days, I have been wondering how Jesus can be our Bread of Life: how can his word nourish and sustain us such that when we feed on it, he lives in us and we in him?

In this regard, I find it very helpful to read the Gospel with my life, to dialogue with it with my life. How might you begin? By setting aside, say, fifteen minutes, by becoming quiet, by sitting still, maybe in a favourite chair, and by recalling the presence of Jesus with you.

Then I suggest you read the Gospel passage slowly and stop every so often to ask how this has been true in your life or what questions it raises as you try to follow Jesus each day. Let's take this Sunday's Gospel reading as an example.

Jesus has just fed the five thousand. He goes off to be by himself. The people come looking for him and find him. You might pause here and remember with gratitude the times when you have been searching for him and the places in which you have found him. In the dialogue with his disciples which follows, Jesus tells them not to work for food that cannot last but for the food that endures to eternal life. Here you might remind yourself of those times when you have gone after food that doesn't last, after those things that haven't brought the fulfilment you have longed for. You might then ask the Lord to give you the spirit of discernment so that you can tell the difference between what lasts and what does not, and the courage to choose the former.

Jesus then goes on to say, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent". You might then spend some moments naming some of the people who have helped you believe, whose example have shown you how to follow Jesus, and give thanks for them.

And then there are the striking final words of the reading. "I am the Bread of Life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, whoever believes in me will never be thirsty". How do these words strike you? They set me thinking about how in my daily life it is possible to have a relationship with Jesus so intimate that all I seek and long for is satisfied in him. It quite takes my breath away! We might ask that we might be able to help others come to know him in this same personal way.

You can then end with a few moments of conversation with Jesus about whatever is foremost in your mind. By reading with our lives a passage from the Gospels, such as the one we hear this Sunday, we can discover how Jesus is our Bread of Life and so be nourished and sustained by him. I finds praying in this way helpful and I hope you might as well.
