FAREWELL TO FARM STREET

This will be my last weekend at Farm Street. On Wednesday I move to St Wilfrid's, Preston to take over from Fr. Peter Randall, S.J. as Parish Priest. This Newsletter article is, therefore, a thank you and a farewell.

Farm Street Church is blessed with some very remarkable people. There are many volunteers who contribute so much to the life of this community. Over this period of Covid members of the parish have generously made themselves available to act as Stewards in the church and we have almost always managed to have someone available throughout the day. Most impressively over this same period we have opened our doors for the Central London Catholic Churches lunches for the homeless on Saturdays and Wednesdays, which involves a large team of volunteers and a great deal or organisation. Now we are opening up again we are grateful to those involved in the Children's Liturgy and sacramental programmes; those who serve, read and act as ministers of Holy Communion and do the welcoming at Mass; those who serve the refreshments after Mass and many others, my apologies to anybody I have missed out. I would particularly want to thank the volunteers of the St Vincent de Paul Society for whom I have been Chaplain for the last few years. I will miss our Monday evenings going out with food, clothing and toiletries to meet the homeless on the streets of Mayfair.

However, it is not just the volunteers who keep Farm Street going. Our Parish Staff are central to all that happens here: George, the Parish Secretary; Patricia, our Finance Officer; Leninha, our Catechist; Sebastian, the Site Manager; Juan, who cleans the church. We are also dependent on the staff of the London Jesuit Centre in many ways. In addition we have David Graham, Duncan Aspen and the Farm Street Singers who provide us with such wonderful music. Thank you too, of course to my fellow Jesuits in the Mount Street Community for all that they do.

All of these things often happen unnoticed and unsung, but they all contribute to all that we are able to do for those who some here. One of the main things people say about Farm Street is that they are welcome here and people often say how they have been helped being able to come to this church and by the help they have received from the staff and parishioners. Much of this cost money and we have been blessed with some very generous benefactors who help to keep the place going, who have enabled us to make the church

such a good and beautiful space for prayer and worship, and who have responded to generously to appeals for help, such as the Bakhita House Appeal. We are God's hands in the world and through you the Spirit has done so much in this place over the years.

I am aware that I have not always been the most helpful and patient of people, but I am grateful to those of who have said that in various I was I have been able to be of help to them over the last eight years. St Paul writes about "God, whose power working in us can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine". I am grateful if God has been able to take the small efforts I have been able make and use them for his greater glory.

There is much for us to be grateful for. I thank you for your generosity and friendship. May God continue to bless this community, may it continue to be a place of welcome, openness and generosity; a place which speaks to people of the love and the glory of God; a place where the Good News of the Gospel is lived out in the generous service of the people of Farm Street Church
