KINGDOM OF GOD

As the preface in today's Mass makes abundantly clear, Christ's kingdom is very different from the kingdoms we know in this world. It is: "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace." In other words, it is not only a kingdom of this world, as Jesus himself explained to Pilate who had asked him if he was a king.

Throughout his life Jesus showed he had not come to seize power by escaping from it, that he had come not to be served, but to serve. For this is the way he established his kingdom and the way he helps others. It must be our way too and the way of the Church he founded.

But it is very hard to put this into practice in real life. For it is a lesson little understood in the world around us, where power is sought by many and often wielded by force and might. This is the fundamental reason for so much injustice we see in many different countries, including our own. The poor and weak are helped, but only in a sporadic and superficial way that does little to change their condition.

This points to an important failure to realize it is no longer sufficient to give alms or other forms of charity to help the poor. What needs to be done is to change the situation of a society responsible for making them or keeping them poor.

And we can now do this. For the first time in human history we can plan and build the sort of society we want. The Church's social teaching has a key role to play here since it can show us the sort of society that accords with gospel principles and help us to build it.

Catholic social teaching does not oppose market economies but does require that human beings and their relationships with others must be the central focus, that their dignity and freedom must be respected, that goods should be used for the benefit of all, and that the legitimate right to property should be respected but also properly exercised. Therefore it rejects indiscriminate consumption, lack of concern for those who are marginalized and lack of respect for the environment. It considers that any economic model supporting these values is unrealistic, unstable and immoral. And it is clear that culture based on 'having' and 'enjoying' more rather than on 'being' more, destroys people and foisters life styles contrary to freedom, justice and the welfare of those who are poorest.

Today's Mass is inviting us to understand such a kingdom, to seek it and to help construct it. This should now be my charitable work rather than handouts for others.
