THE SOUND OF GOD

We are surrounded by noise. The cacophony of daily life leaves us sometimes bewildered, confused and annoyed by its persistent presence and we long for some peace and quiet to recollect ourselves. This is a good instinct in us for if we are continually bombarded by noise, we can easily become disorientated and can even lose sight of what is of vital importance in our lives. The inventions of technology can help or hinder us in that regard but there really is no substitute for quiet reflection.

The life stories of many of the Saints bears witness to how they came to realize that God Himself was, in a sense, speaking to them through the events which occurred in their lives and that by "listening" to this, they could attune their lives more in keeping with their deeper and truest nature, which is where we can discover how God does indeed "speak" to us. However if our lives are so busy that we have no time to spare, we run the risk of remaining somewhat deaf to this sound of God.

St Ignatius of Loyola discovered in his own life the way that God was addressing him and he stumbled across this rather unexpectedly. During his recuperation from a severe injury incurred in a battle, he realized that he reacted very differently to reading various kinds of literature. His normal human reaction to historical romances was to experience an emotional high but he found this didn't last very long and it left him feeling somewhat depressed afterwards.

However when he read the lives of some of the Saints and imagined himself doing something similar, he noticed that his reaction was less a high than before but now more joyful and satisfying and he experienced this reaction for a considerably longer period of time. Here then we can say that St Ignatius experienced the sound of God within him but it was a chord which was buried and which he could only hear by reflecting in silence within himself. In a very real sense, he found sanctuary by tuning into his different reactions to reading literature. This indicated to him the way God wanted him to live his life and so he decided to turn his back on his former way of life, a process which took many years.

We too can follow suit but it does require being willing and able to listen to what is going on within us and realizing what in fact gives us a sense of joy and satisfaction over a sustained period of time. Given our uniqueness, this will express itself in different ways in each of us.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus is speaking to us all the time but that we have to be searching for truth in our lives - this means filtering out all the untruths which we hear and indeed which may be living by. However once we become more aware of what is going on we find that little by little we can change and can begin to hear more the voice of God within us. There is no doubt He is there so let us search for truth and live in the hope that in time God's sound will strike a chord in us.
