THE COMING OF THE ADVOCATE

We are now heading towards the celebration in just two weeks' time of the Solemnity of Pentecost when we shall remember the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles after Jesus' Ascension into heaven.

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus looks forward to the coming of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. The Last Supper is over, and Jesus will shortly be betrayed. Jesus is preparing his disciples for his departure. His are words of encouragement. What does he have to say?

Firstly, that he will not leave them orphans, leave them bereft of his presence. No, he shall ask the Father to send them the Spirit of Truth who will be with them forever. In John's Gospel, the Holy Spirit is the presence of Jesus with the disciples when Jesus himself is no longer with them. The physical absence of Jesus is overcome, as one commentator puts it, by the never-ending presence of the Holy Spirit.

Secondly, the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth, will help the disciples understand what cannot be understood about the identity of Jesus while Jesus is physically with them. As he says, he will help them understand that "I am in the Father and the Father is in me".

Thirdly, his departure and the coming of the Spirit will provide the disciples with an opportunity for greater intimacy with him. Jesus has just given them a new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you". Those who keep this commandment will love him, and those who love him will be loved by the Father and Jesus will love them and will show himself to them.

Loved by the Father and the Son, the disciples are caught up in the love of God himself: in the love the Father has for the Son and the Son for the Father. As Jesus says two verses after the end of this Sunday's excerpt, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him".

"What difference did the coming of the Holy Spirit make to the first disciples?"

In the first reading from Acts, we see what "public" difference it made. Philip took the message about Jesus to the frontiers and beyond, into Samaria, to the Samaritans, forbidden territory for the people of Israel. Here he proclaimed that Good News by words and by actions. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, he performs the same deeds that Jesus himself performed: he cures the sick and castes out evil spirits.

In the reading from the First Letter of Peter, we see the "personal" difference the Holy Spirit made to

those disciples who had to withstand persecution. The author advises the first Christians for whom he wrote to have their answers ready and always to respond to accusers with "courtesy and respect" - surely fruits of the Holy Spirit - so that those who make the accusations will see by their manner of life how false those accusations are. But if their persecutors persist, the Holy Spirit will shape the likeness of Jesus in them. These disciples will then be following Jesus more closely, he who "in the body was put to death but in the spirit was raised to life".

There are two ways in which thee reading s can be lived by us.

We can read over the Gospel reading and as we do so reflect on the intimacy of our relationship with Jesus, caught up as we are in the love of God himself - in the love the Father has for the Son and the Son for the Father.

As we read about Philip and his mission to the Samaritans, we can look for opportunities to join in the mission of the Church of reaching out to those who have not yet heard the Gospel, those who have heard it and have forgotten it, and those who are estranged from the Church because of a hurt they have suffered.

In these ways, the Word of God given us this Sunday can take flesh in our lives today and we can give witness to the presence of the Holy Spirit powerfully at work in our world.
