# Jesus and the Crowds: The Blood of the Galilean

On the first Sunday of Lent, we accompanied Jesus as he was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert in order to be tempted by the devil (Luke 4:1-13). On the second Sunday, we ascended the mountain in Galilee with him where he went to pray. There, three of his disciples had a sight of his glory and heard him speaking with Moses and Elijah about his forthcoming passion and death in Jerusalem (Luke 9:28-36). On this third Lenten Sunday, we join Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. This journey lasts ten chapters in Luke. Its content seems to owe nothing to Mark's gospel, but it contains much material similar to that of Matthew. But on this Sunday and the next, Luke's work has no parallels in other gospels. It is Luke's voice that

The best image by which to understand Jesus on his journey is that of a prophet like Isaiah or Hosea; Jesus "was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people" (Luke 24:19). A prophet calls a sinful people to repentance (e.g., Isaiah 1:16; Hosea 6:1); he pleads with them to turn aside from sin and to live in accordance with the law which God had given to Moses. So Jesus reacts to the tragic deaths of those killed by Pilate's soldiers and to the fate of those who perished through the fall of a tower, by calling the crowds around him to repentance. God was offering them the chance of salvation; they must not miss it.

He also spoke a parable about a fig tree. The fig tree whose barrenness symbolised their failure to live out the life that God wanted them to live, would soon be cut down, but not immediately. God in his mercy was giving them more time. On this third Sunday, each of us is reminded that Lent is a time for repentance and penance.
