SYNOD BISHOPS IN ROME, OCTOBER 2023



Synod of Bishops in Rome October 2023

As many of us know, the Synod of Bishops in Rome is fast approaching; an important stage in the synodal journey which the Pope called us to back in October 2021.

We have been through the initial stage of listening to each other, and the views from churches around the world have been considered at the various continental assemblies.

The continental assemblies used the scripture inspired theme of 'expanding the tent'.

'Enlarge the site of your tent, and let the curtains of your habitations be stretched out; do not hold back; lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes,' (Isaiah 54, 2)

The churches around the world have made their different concerns known to the Bishops, and the Vatican has now published the working document for the assembly of Bishops to use in October.

These concerns inevitably vary, and include wars in many parts of our world, climate change and the needs of minority communities, especially in the poorest regions.

Local churches have their own local concerns, and the Pope is clear that the Bishops assembly is not a debate or a 'parliament' but a further opportunity for deepening discernment on these complex issues.

From the beginning of calling us into synodality, Pope Francis has encouraged us-the laity, religious and clergy, to continue in this listening process and, as well as listening to each other, to be fully open to listening to the Holy Spirit.

We are encouraged to do this in ways that are right for us in our own situations in life. This may be in our own prayer lives, in our family and friendship groups or in prayer activities, wherever we engage with God.

As part of the Farm Street synod process, we have put on several activities.

The synod day in January of this year was attended by around 30 people and we are organizing another of these events on Saturday 15th July.

This will be held again at the Aula Magna Hall and will last from 10-4:30pm. The link to the program and the details of the day can be found on the Synod page of the Farm Street website under the Faith tab.

We have been running a monthly Synod prayer group with 10 members, and we have met on the 3rd Wednesday evening of each month since last September for prayer in the Ignatian style of lectio divina.

Once the Pope extended the synod until October 2024, we in the prayer group decided to continue and we are opening to new members.

Pope Francis has also declared Saturday 30th September 2023 as a World Day of Prayer for the Synod Assembly in October, so the Farm Street Synod team is organizing a day of prayer which will be based at the new Cana lounge in the basement of 14 Mount Street.

In Summary, the Farm Street Synod team has the following three activities to supplement any personal involvement you may have in discerning the prompts of the Holy Spirit to guide the journey of our catholic communion into the future:

- 1. A synod day at 14 Mount Street, Aula Magna room Saturday 15th July 10:30-4:30, full details to be published on the Farm Street website synod page imminently.

- 3. We are organizing a Quiet Day of prayer on Saturday 30th September (World Day of Prayer for the Synod Assembly) at the Cana Lounge in the basement of Mount Street. It will follow the 10-4:30 timing and the program details will be published on the Farm Street website synod page in due course.
