I BELIEVE IN THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE OF THE WORLD TO COME

This Sunday's first reading, from the Second Book of Maccabees, and especially the Gospel reading in which we hear the Sadducees argue with Jesus about the Resurrection and the life of heaven, make me wonder, and perhaps make you wonder as well, about the life of heaven and what it might be like.

"What is heaven like?" is a question I've been asked many times. When I was teaching in secondary schools, it was often on the lips of students, six formers especially. When working in parishes, I've found it is not infrequently asked by those who have lost a loved one, not usually immediately before or after the funeral mass but more often some months later.

I find the most attractive answer to that question, and for that reason perhaps the most compelling, is one I put like this.

Here we experience ourselves as people with many desires, the deepest of which, perhaps, are for peace, justice, security and happiness; for well-being, deeply satisfying truth and of course, above all, for love. In the life of heaven these deepest longings find complete fulfilment.

If our experience of peace, justice, security, happiness, satisfying truth and love are too often transitory, in the life of heaven that experience will be deep and complete. Our restless seeking will be no more, and we will come home, which is why, perhaps, when praying for the dead, we pray "Eternal rest give unto them, O Lord".

But this will be no abstract state: it will be personal. "Do not let your hearts be troubled: trust in God, trust also in me". These are words from the Gospel of St John often heard at funeral masses. In this reading, Jesus tells his disciples, shortly before his betrayal, suffering and death, that "I go to prepare a place for you, so that where I am you may be also". This life of heaven is personal: where he is, where Jesus is, we shall be also.

This matches with our experience today. It's in relationship, in the intimacy of our relationships, in the reciprocity of such relationships, that we find peace and happiness and our sense of well-being. What we find here, in the way we find it here, we will find in its fullness in heaven.

A great many years ago, a priest said to me that he looked forward to death. At the time, I found what he said rather perverse, and in some ways, I still do. Thought of in these terms, however, we can look forward to the life of heaven: it attracts us and draws us on through life. But it does so not in a way that means we ignore what goes on around us with our eyes fixed instead on the future. No, in attracting us forward, it gives us the strength we need to get involved with the world around us, to live the Gospel of Jesus and to build the Kingdom of justice, peace and love in the here and now, which one day, we trust, for each and all of us, will find its fulfilment in the life of heaven.
