Summary of 2022 Financial Report

- The parish's main sources of income are the weekly offertory and donations from Baptisms, Weddings and Memorials.
- This income was hit badly throughout the Covid pandemic, during which a significant deficit (£323K) was built up.
- When compared to the last non-Covid year (2019), cash offertory for the year ending 2022 was down 30%.
- However, this fall in cash offertory was more than offset by the introduction of new ways of giving (e.g. contactless payments and website donations), with total offertory and general donations ending the year up 9% (vs YE-2019).
- Income from Standing Orders is particularly important, as it provides both stable income and the highest Gift Aid returns. We would encourage parishioners to setup a regular Standing Order (Gift Aided) if they are able.
- Income from Baptisms, Weddings and Memorials is 35% below budget and the Parish team are taking steps to improve this in 2023.
- Expenditure on utilities increased significantly for YE-2022 and this trend is likely to continue in 2023
- There were several fixed asset purchases (computers) and one-off expenses related to the live-streaming of masses.
- The deficit for the year ending 2022 is: £115,000.
- We expect this to improve in 2023, ending the year balanced or slightly positive.
