GRATITUDE

Only one of the ten cured lepers came back to thank Jesus and he was a Samaritan, a person despised by the Jews. It is a powerful and very clear story that relates to every one of us, especially to us Christians who have been given the grace of believing in the one true God.

For this we should be full of gratitude and giving thanks to God should be one of the main purposes of our prayer. Psalm 92 says: "It is good to give thanks to the Lord" and psalm 69 goes further: "Thanksgiving will please the Lord better than an ox".

But what should we thank God for? Once again Scripture gives clear indications. We should thank God for Christ, for people and for food. Obviously there are many other motives for thanking God, and each of us may have very special and personal ones. It is a valuable exercise to consider what these are in detail. We should look at our own lives, from the earliest time we can remember up to the present, to see how God has been accompanying and guiding us over the years through so many different occasions and experiences. This cannot help increasing our sense of gratitude and thanksgiving.

To have no sense of gratitude means that we don't recognize God's presence in our lives, and act as if we alone are in charge and responsible for all we do. This can easily lead us to the sort of pride that is the root of all evil and sin. Clearly we have some responsibility for what we do, but it is neither absolute nor wholly exclusive. St Paul was only too well aware that to trust in self was to court failure whereas trusting in God ensures both strength and security. The same is true of those who trust in riches, in high and fortified walls, in bows or swords, or in any other idol. They are equally doomed to failure.

This is an occasion to ask myself: Who or what do I really trust in? When I have a problem or am in difficulty or in danger, where do I actually put my trust? Is it in God or in someone or something else? If it is the former, we can make our own the beautiful communion antiphon in today's Mass: "Those who seek the Lord lack no blessing".

For in thanking God we are not giving him anything that he needs. It is we who benefit. St Paul reminds us very clearly that that God is not dependent "on anything that human hands can do for him, since he can never be in need of anything". (Acts 17,25)

So let us never fail to give thanks, to show our gratitude, for in this way it is we ourselves who will grow.
