A GENTLE WHISPER

You sometimes hear it said that "the young people of this country have utterly lost any sense of religion". I have to say, as one who has worked mainly with young people, in schools and in chaplaincies, that this is not my experience, though the young do not always know quite as much about their religion as we might wish. Quite recently, as is often the case at this time of year, I was working with some excellent young people in Lourdes, who clearly understood the importance of what goes on there. And I have to say that's when instructing couples for marriage in this parish or preparing them for the baptism of their children, my overwhelming impression is that they are serious about their religion; they are not simply going through it for form's sake, or to pacify their parents. This insight has been reinforced in the last few days, when I had the great pleasure of attending the first vows as religious, in different orders, of two young Oxbridge graduates, a woman and a man, who with their lives before them, and all sorts of possible choices to make, can think of nothing better than to give themselves wholly to God in this extraordinary way. At the same time I was privileged to meet a most impressive young woman, currently a novice in a woman's order, who was rejoicing because it has been confirmed that she too can go on and take her first vows. All three of these people were very well aware that they were taking on quite a serious challenge, not least because in most cases, the order they were joining had a heavy preponderance of older people. But no matter: that was where the call lay, and that was what they knew they had to do.

The point here is that above all we have to listen out for the call of God. That call has not ceased to echo in our lives; and if we are to find the happiness for which we are created then it is our urgent task to listen out for where the call is taking us. So how are we to do this? Above all, the first thing to remember is that God is always seeking to attract our attention, always trying to reveal to us the unconditional love that is right at the heart of who God is. And there is that within us that responds, at the very deepest level of our being, to this love, that recognises God's call as the only thing that matters.

But the problem here is that there is an awful lot of noise in our culture, and in the culture of all young people today, which tends to drown out that divine whisper, and prevent us from hearing what it is saying. One thing that you might like to try is what the prophet Eli told the boy Samuel to say when the voice addressed him in the middle of the night. It is a splendid story, which you will find, beautifully narrated, at 1 Samuel 3 (and actually, while you are about it, you could do worse than read the whole of the opening three chapters of the book; you will not regret it). What Eli tells the boy is to say "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening"; and that does the trick: God tells him. When the voice comes to us, it comes not noisily but quietly, leaving a deep sense of peace. Now to hear that voice, one thing above all that we require, is some silence; and that means that each of us, sometime during the day, needs to sit in quiet, and turn off those noises with which we are constantly surrounded, and then listen. That tiny voice will be there, looking to attract your attention. Just let it speak.
