GUARDED UNDER THE SHADOW OF GOD'S WINGS

On a visit to Paris when I was young, one of the treats which lay in store was a visit to the Eiffel Tower. Famous since it's construction for the World Exhibition at the beginning of the last century, it had become one of the most famous landmarks in the world. Of course I had seen photographs of it and television shots of it, so in many ways I was prepared to see it. However, nothing could really have prepared me for what I saw for myself, to look at it closely, to touch it, and to ascend the lift to the top to see the panorama of Paris laid out before my eyes.

My first surprise, even 'though I was familiar with it, was to see its colour. I thought it would be sort of rusty or copper, patchy in places and worn down by the weather and scratched. What I did not expect was the even chocolate coating which ran up and down its length with a uniform consistency and which gave it a mellower, warmer and softer appearance instead of it just being a huge rusty metal construction. However, what struck me most of all was the sheer size of the thing: it was enormous. Although I knew it was big, I had never seen anything so massive in my young life; it just took my breath away seeing its columns plunge into the earth and curving upwards, on and on until it narrowed and finally tapered into the blue sky above. A vast immovable structure making me and my friends feel somewhat insignificant beneath its shadow.

The theme of today's reading reminds us of another kind of towering figure, but in this case it is the vastness of God. We are asked to reflect on His power and presence everywhere. This is not something we should be afraid of, in the ordinary sense of that term, since God is our friend and his Son Jesus calls us brothers and sisters. Still, when we think that, as the Entrance Antiphon says, that we shelter under the shadow of His wings, then we can get a sense of just how pervasive God's presence is. You see, it's all very well hearing about God from a pulpit but as in this case with my experience of the tower, there really is no substitute for a personal encounter with Him. And this is there for the asking for each one of us, as today's Gospel reminds us.

As I was left with a sense of awe at the foot of the Eiffel Tower, so too should we have a similar sense about being in the presence of God ourselves at every moment of our lives. God is there, watching over us, stepping in to help us when he thinks we need it or leaving us to ourselves to see how we get on without Him. All of our lives, every moment of every day, are spent under the shadow of the towering figure of God whose presence fills the universe. Let us then not be afraid of anything or anyone and let remind ourselves of the Gospel reading from St Luke that God is there and to turn to Him to ask for help or simply to thank for all He has given and continues to give to us.
